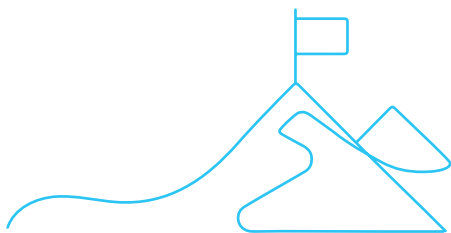


The HGC

The Hellenic Gaming Commission (HGC) is an independent administrative authority with the mission of regulating, supervising and monitoring games of chance in Greece, in order to ensure the legality and fairness of gaming activities, protect players, minors and society as a whole, as well as public interests.

Vision

The vision of the HGC is to shape the gambling market in Greece, with the best possible protection of players, the greatest possible positive fiscal and social impact, minimising delinquency and illegal activities, and ensuring that businesses remain financially sound, extroverted, innovative and sustainable in the long term.



Mission

The mission of the HGC is the smooth and dynamic operation of the gambling market in Greece, focusing on the best possible protection of players, the effective supervision of the market and dealing with illegal networks. Its operation should be based on rationality, transparency, collectivity, efficiency, innovation and a high sense of responsibility.

The structure of the HGC

The Committee is composed of nine members, appointed by the Minister of Economy and Finance. The President of the HGC is appointed by virtue of a decision by the Minister of Economy and Finance, following an opinion by the Hellenic Parliament's Committee on Institutions and Transparency. The President has general responsibility for the work and the overall supervision of the Authority's operation, presiding over the HGC's meetings.

Strategic axes 2023-2027

The five strategic axes of the HGC are:

1. Effective protection of players and optimisation of the overall positive footprint of the gambling market.
2. Minimising illegal and irregular behaviour in the gaming sector and its negative effects.
3. Supporting long-term sustainability in the gaming industry, the development of new investments, innovation and extroversion.
4. Adequate staffing, organisational restructuring and reinforcement of the HGC's logistics in order to strengthen its supervisory, guiding and monitoring role, among others.
5. Continuous development of the HGC's national and international

extroversion, as well as continuous strengthening of transparency and collectivity in its operation.
